**AN ORDINANCE SUPPLEMENTING THE CODE  
OF THE BOROUGH OF FRANKLIN LAKES TO  
ESTABLISH CHAPTER 377 "PUBLIC UTILITIES"**

*Summary – This ordinance establishes requirements for excavations by public utilities including the requirement to remove utility poles when replaced with new utility poles.*

**REFUNDING BOND ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF  
FRANKLIN LAKES, IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN,  
STATE OF NEW JERSEY PROVIDING FOR THE  
REFUNDING OF ALL OR A PORTION OF THE  
BOROUGH'S OUTSTANDING GENERAL  
IMPROVEMENT BONDS, SERIES 2008, AUTHORIZING  
THE ISSUANCE OF NOT EXCEEDING \$5,000,000  
AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF REFUNDING  
BONDS OF THE BOROUGH TO EFFECT SUCH  
REFUNDING AND APPROPRIATING THE PROCEEDS  
THEREOF.**

*Summary – This ordinance authorizes the refinancing of 2008 general improvement bonds, with a projected savings to the Borough in excess of \$300,000.*

## OPEN THE TIME FOR PUBLIC COMMENT

Motion to open the time for public comment was made by Councilmember Ramsey, seconded by Councilmember Kelly. On voice vote, all in favor.

Brandy Sacco, 2015 Stokes Farm Road. Ms. Sacco came forward and read a statement regarding the burial ground at 1115 Franklin Lake Road. She is requesting that the cemetery be preserved and to stop the property owner from damaging the cemetery. She is asking that the home owner stop taking down more trees and that the easement be enforced. She is also asking that it be required that the grave yard be cleaned and that the cemetery be recognized as a historical site.

Mayor Bivona takes exception that the town has ignored the site. He said that they do their best to protect the cemetery. The Borough is in touch with the homeowner and he is required to do certain things before a building permit is issued. The town will monitor the construction and access is allowed to the cemetery and are willing to work with the DRA and the homeowner.

Borough Attorney, Bill Smith, said that the deed does not create an easement.

Gayle Loftis, an attorney, wants to create a measure of access but they have gotten no response to the request.

Jim Scattergood, 395 Crescent Drive. Mr. Scattergood asked if the Borough had an ordinance creating a set back from a cemetery. The State legislates set-backs when the town does not have one.

Councilwoman Ramsey expressed her concern and is sympathetic to the group. The group is willing to work with the homeowner to clean up the site. They will fundraise to clean up the property. The homeowner has received a benefit in a reduction of taxes since the cemetery is on his property.

**Resolution 277-16 Amend Personnel Policies and Procedure Manual**

**BE IT RESOLVED** by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Franklin Lakes, County of Bergen and State of New Jersey, that paragraph 28 “Use of Vehicles Policy” of the Personnel Policies and Procedures Manual and the Employee Handbook is hereby amended to read as follows:

**28) Use of Vehicles Policy.**

Borough owned vehicles shall be used only on official business and all passengers must be on Borough business.

Vehicles may be taken home only with the advance approval of the Borough Administrator except a Department Head may also grant temporary approval to facilitate responses to after-hours emergency calls. When an employee takes home a Borough vehicle, it is to be used only for official Borough business; any other use is not permitted. Any violation of this policy constitutes cause for disciplinary action.

*Employees authorized to use such vehicles for commuting to or from work shall have a fringe benefit value added to the gross income reported on the employee’s W-2, unless the vehicle meets the “qualified non-personal vehicle” criteria specified by the IRS.*

Employees shall be compensated for mileage and tolls when personal vehicles are used for official Borough business and for training or seminars that are approved in advance by the Borough Administrator. The rate of compensation for mileage shall be equal to the rate established by the Federal government for mileage reimbursement.

**BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED** that a copy of this resolution be forwarded to every employee.

**Resolution 278-16 Appoint Borough Administrator to Monitor PILOT’s**

**BE IT RESOLVED**, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Franklin Lakes, County of Bergen and State of New Jersey that the Borough Administrator be and is hereby appointed to monitor exemptions granted to the Long-Term Exemption Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:21-1, *et seq.*, and Five-Year Exemptions/Abatements granted pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:21-1, *et seq.*, commonly referred to as payments in lieu of taxes (“PILOTs”); and,

**Resolution 283-16 Liens for Property Maintenance Costs**

**WHEREAS**, Borough Code §373-3.1 “Cost of removal as lien; collection” of Chapter 373 “Property Maintenance” of the Code of the Borough of Franklin Lakes, provides that, when a property owner fails to comply with a notice to remove brush, weeds, dead and dying trees, stumps, roots, obnoxious growths, filth, garbage, trash and debris that is inimical to the public health, safety and general welfare or likely to constitute a fire hazard, the Borough may remove such condition and impose a lien in accordance with the following process:

“The Enforcement Officer shall certify the costs thereof to the Mayor and Council. Upon receipt of the certificate, the Mayor and Council shall examine and, if found correct, shall cause the costs as shown thereon to be charged against the lands. The amount so charged shall forthwith become a lien upon such lands and shall be added to and become and form part of the taxes next to be assessed and levied upon such lands. Such amount shall bear interest at the same rate as taxes and shall be collected and enforced by the same officers and in the same manner as taxes.”

**WHEREAS**, the Borough Administrator has been working with the Borough Risk Manager to develop an incentive program for Borough employees to move to lower cost medical plans, which would be offered to Borough employees as part of the Open Enrollment period, which starts on October 24, 2016; and,

**WHEREAS**, the Uniform Shared Services and Consolidation Act (N.J.S.A. 40A:65-1, *et seq.*) promotes the broad use of shared services as a technique to reduce local expenses funded by property taxpayers; and,

**WHEREAS**, the Uniform Shared Services and Consolidation Act (N.J.S.A. 40A:65-1, *et seq.*) allows for any local unit to enter into an agreement with any other local unit or units to provide or receive any services that each local participating in the Agreement is empowered to provide or receive within its own jurisdiction; and,

**WHEREAS**, it is in the best interests of the Borough and its residents to enter into the Agreement;
