




Police service calls




Police service calls: Calls for Service or CAD Tickets as we refer to them, are generated when police activity of any type is performed, either by the officer being dispatched (such as an alarm or medical call, etc.), action initiated on his own (motor vehicle stops, vacant house checks, etc.) or scheduled activities such as court appearances. While there has been an overall increase in the number of calls that the Police Department responds to over the last several years, the increase shown in the graph also reflects a change in dispatch protocol. CFS reports are now generated for more of the activities that we have always performed such as daily school walk through inspections, motor vehicle stops arising from stationary traffic details and vacant house checks. This change was made in order to track activity so that we may make better use of our resources.

Police Department Traffic Summonses


Total Jan-Sept



Traffic summonses: The Traffic Summons graph reflects the total number of traffic summonses issued by officers for traffic offenses as defined by NJ Title 39 Traffic Laws and violations of Borough traffic offenses such as parking. Intermittent spikes in summons production totals are usually found in months where extra patrols are performed due to grants such as "Click it or Ticket" and "Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over." The department also initiates "Enforcement and Education" details periodically which may also result in an increase in production. These details will usually target seat belt and cell phone violations. Summons production is down considerably due to the Covid-19 crisis. Fewer motorists have been on the road due to the stay at home / work from home orders that were put in place.


Police Department Total Crimes

Total crimes: The "Total Crimes" graph represents the number of crimes reported to the FBI on the monthly Uniform Crime Report (UCR). The crimes reported in the monthly UCR report are: Homicide, Rape, Robbery, Assault, Burglary, Larceny, Motor Vehicle Theft and Arson. The "Total crimes" graph does not reflect arrests made by the Police Department.
